## A. Deputy Jailer

- a. General Duties Responsible for the direct daily supervision of persons incarcerated. Ensuring their safety and well-being, while supervising their activities and maintaining control over their actions. Prevent escapes and prepare the inmates as necessary for appearance at judicial proceedings.
- b. Examples of Duties
  - (a) Maintain care and custody of inmates.
  - (b) Performs data entry of pertinent information.
  - (c) Collects and counts money that is brought to the facility.
  - (d) Book and search inmates upon admittance.
  - (e) Maintain proper security, including making rounds and head counts.
  - (f) Ensure that inmates follow proper procedures relating to personal hygiene.
  - (g) Ensure that inmates clean and sanitize living areas.
  - (h) Assist with serving meals.
  - (i) Check all incoming mail.
  - (i) Supervise inmate work details.
  - (k) Report infractions of rules and unusual occurrences.
  - (I) Prepare inmates for court appearances and release.
  - (m) Transport and assist in transportation of inmates.
  - (n) Supervise the visiting of prisoners.
  - (o) Prepare daily activity reports, incident reports and unusual occurrence reports as required. Perform other related duties as may be assigned.
  - (p) Knows and understand fire evacuation procedure.
- c. Supervision Received Work is performed under the direction of the Lieutenant through the Captain and other supervisory officers as indicted by the chain of command.
- **d.** Supervision Exercised No supervision is exercised except in cases of trainees performing on the job trainee activities.
- e. Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities
  - (a) Must have knowledge and ability to command respect, maintain control and act quickly in emergencies.
  - (b) Can control the conduct and personal habits of inmates.
  - (c) Have good power of observation and judgment and be able to deal firmly and fairly with inmates.
  - (d) Must be alert and can work harmoniously with others.
- **f.** Desirable Experience, Education and Training No experience is necessary, but a high school education or equivalent is desired. The applicant must be willing to undergo extensive training in the care and custody of inmates.
